
Courtyard Worship

Mission & Service

Vestry Notes, September 14, 2020

(These Vestry notes are a brief summary and are not intended to serve as official minutes.)

The meeting was called to order by president, Jen Mazur. August minutes were approved. The Vestry was apprised of the latest meeting of the Reopening Task Force and offered some suggestions for consideration. A Mutual Ministry Committee will be established for pastor, minister of music and deaconess according to the bylaws; Dcs. Deborah offered a resource to think about function and purpose; the three program staff members will come back with suggestions for their individual mutual ministers. Job description updates for Property Manager and Church Financial Administrator were presented by Personnel and were approved. A budget timeline has been established; initial budget requests should be submitted by staff and committees no later than October 9; requests should be based on the assumption that Trinity will be back in full operation for 2021. Pastor Alan gave an update on the apartment wall which is crumbling and impacting the parking lot; he has been in contact with the property owner and work has begun, but has now ceased; Pastor will follow up. Franki Aitken presented the July Treasurer's Report which was approved.

Trinity Finances


Through the first seven months, income remains slightly ahead of budget at \$471,477, while expenses are trending lower due to the shutdown, coming in at \$451,268. There has been a slight fall off of member giving in the summer which may or may not indicate a broader trend. We thank the members of Trinity for your continued generosity and faithfulness. Northeastern Pennsylvania Synod



NEPA Synod Assembly October 2020

Due to the pandemic, the 2020 NE Pennsylvania Synod Assembly with the election of a new bishop will be conducted online. Trinity's voting members are Steve Hofmann, Pat Richter, Deaconess Deborah Graf, and Pastor Alan Wolkenhauer. The entire proceedings will be available online and visitors are welcome to view any or all of the Assembly.

Because the election of a bishop is by ecclesiastical ballot, and because lengthy online sessions are extremely fatiguing, the Assembly will be conducted on two successive weekends. The first ballot, on which the name of any pastor rostered in the ELCA can be entered, will happen on Friday evening, Oct. 16.

The second session will be held on Sunday afternoon, Oct. 18, at which time there will be a second ballot. The top seven candidates will be notified, vetted, and invited to come to The Lutheran Center the following Friday evening, Oct. 23, to answer questions prepared by the Election Team based on input from surveying the synod.

Then on Saturday morning, Oct. 24, a third ballot will be conducted. Saturday afternoon the three finalists will be introduced and offered an opportunity to address the Assembly. Following that will be a fourth ballot, and later a fifth ballot. (Note: a tie on the fourth or fifth ballot could result in a sixth ballot.)

Other business of the synod will be conducted throughout the sessions, including a presentation from our Churchwide representative (still to be determined), adoption of the spending plan and compensation guidelines, other elections, debate on various resolutions brought to the Assembly, and other traditional and/or required reports and presentations.

There will be an online worship service prior the beginning of the first session on Friday, Oct. 16; and the offering for World Hunger will be received through a “Donate” button on the synod website.
