A Blessing from the Bard House: Epiphanies

Epiphany: January 6 observed as a church festival in commemoration of the coming of the Magi as the first manifestation of Christ to the Gentiles *epiphany* - illuminating discovery, realization, or disclosure



In 2024, Trinity will transfer the celebration of Epiphany to Sunday, January 7, when we will mark the holy day with a service of lessons and carols.

As you know, I will be retiring at the end of 2024. If you would have asked me last year at this time when I would be retiring, I would have shrugged my shoulders. Many people said, "You'll know when it's time." I would shake my head, roll my eyes, and laugh. Now I know that to be a true statement. Chalking the Door: Epiphany House Blessing Kits

"Bless this house and all who inhabit it. Fill us with the light of Christ, that our concern for others may reflect your love."

The tradition of marking our homes, usually at the front or main entrance, with sacred signs and symbols is an intentional way to ask God's blessing upon those who live, work, or visit throughout the coming year. In Exodus, the Israelites marked their doors with blood so that the Lord would pass over their homes; but in this blessing liturgy, we mark our doors with chalk as a sign that we have invited God's presence and blessing into our homes. On Sunday, January 7 we will be celebrating the feast of the Epiphany. House blessing kits with prayers and chalk will be available to bring home.

Faith Formation Updates

2024 is a new year with new opportunities for growing in your faith and deepening your relationship with God and others. Sunday Forums will generally be held in the Hintz Room from 9:00 – 9:45 AM. TLC (Trinity Learning Circle) for kids will begin on Sunday, January 14th. Deaconess Deborah along with volunteers will be teaching. TLC is geared towards kids from PreK-6th grade. Youth in 7th grade and up are welcome and encouraged to be helpers during the classes.

ChAOS (Catechism And Other Stuff) for youth grades 7-10 will begin on Sunday, January 21 from 6:00 - 7:30 PM. This 6-session unit will focus on worship: why we do what we do. Pastor Hans will be present for the first evening when youth will be trained as acolytes and learn about this important ministry.

Join Pastor Hans for a bible study on First Corinthians 8 as we seek to answer the question: how can we truly place God first in our lives, when so many idols bid us to bow down?
