In the mercy of almighty God, Jesus Christ was given to die for us, and for his sake God forgives us all our sins.



COMMUNION CANTICLE



DISTRIBUTION

All who trust that Jesus Christ is present in this holy meal are invited to receive communion.

Please follow the direction of the usher; if your pew is located on one of the side aisles, walk to the rear of the sanctuary. Two lines will form in the center aisle. The left line will commune at the left side of the altar rail; the right line will commune on the right side.

When you reach the front of the sanctuary, there are serving trays located on the tables. Please choose either an empty glass to receive wine, or, if you prefer, a prefilled glass in the center ring containing grape juice. After taking your cup, proceed to the rail. Fill in around the rail from the center to the ends. You may stand or kneel as is your preference.

The pastor will give you a piece of bread; eat it when you receive it. If you prefer a gluten free alternative, please inform the pastor.

Then, an assistant will come to offer wine from a pouring chalice. Please extend your glass to be filled with wine or indicate that you have grape juice. After drinking the wine or juice, you are welcome to remain in place for a moment of meditation.

After you finish your time of reflection, please return to your pew, depositing your empty glass in the trays located on the tables at the head of the side aisles.



Worship at Trinity this Lent!

Midday worship: Join us at 12:05 PM in Trinity's chapel for a simple, 25-minute Eucharist on March 20. We'll also hold brief midday services on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday of Holy Week. For those who cannot worship mid-day, we are also welcome to join Common Ground Recovery Community (5 Wyomissing Blvd.) for Holden Evening Prayer at 7:00 PM.

Holy Week (March 24-30)

We'll gather on **Palm Sunday** at 9 AM for a Palm Procession and Prayer Walk through our neighborhood. Our 10 AM worship will include Erik Meyer's setting of the St. John Passion. This beautiful setting is written for four soloists and the choir singing the part of the crowd. The congregation will sing verses of "Herzliebster Jesu" throughout the piece as reflections.

We'll hold **brief midday services** on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday at 12:05 in our chapel.

On **Maundy Thursday**, we'll gather at 7:30 PM for a Festival Eucharist as we celebrate Jesus' institution of the sacrament, his washing of the disciples' feet, and his command to love one another. The service music will include Oliver Messiaen's *Le Banquet Céleste*, Ola Gjeilo's stunning *Ubi Caritas*, and Zebulon Highben's haunting setting of Psalm 88. This service will be broadcast live on Comcast Channel 190 and streamed on Trinity's YouTube channel and Facebook page.

On **Good Friday**, we'll gather at 12:05 PM for worship—with scripture, preaching, and song all focused on the scandal and glory of the cross. In keeping with ancient tradition, the Eucharist is not celebrated on this day and Trinity's bells are silent.

Easter Sunday (March 31): Join us for a very special Eucharist as we celebrate the Resurrection of Our Lord at 10 AM. Music will include the Trinity Brass and Ralph Manuel's *Alleluia*. Join us after the service for an intergenerational egg hunt!

SURPRISE! Intergenerational Easter Egg Hunt after Easter Sunday Worship

In the past, our hunt was for young children; older youth hid eggs full of candy and small gifts. This year, the eggs will also contain surprises for older youth and adults.
